

Safari is not a supported browser for NetLibrary.

Some versions seem to work fine. In others we see various issues. It has been decided by the vendor for now it is not supported.

Information on Schubert PDF Browser Plug-in and "Rosetta emulation" for Mac.

For the Intel based MAC you need to Install Schubert PDF Browser Plug-in and then enable "Rosetta emulation" in Firefox.

NetLibrary contains PDF and HTML titles. You should be fine using the search engine and viewing HTML titles with Firefox.

Below is some information regarding PDF eBooks and the Mac.

How to view NetLibrary PDF eBooks with Firefox, Opera or Camino on a Mac:

The Schubert-It plug-in works well with Firefox, Opera or Camino on a Mac. It may also work with other browsers. . It does not work with Safari as Safari has its own PDF viewer built in and it does not currently work for viewing NetLibrary PDF eBooks.

Instructions for Installing the Schubert PDF Browser Plug-in on a Macintosh Computer 1.Direct your web browser to < <http://www.schubert-it.com> >.

2.Click on the Downloads Link at the top of the page.

3.Click on the down arrow button just to the right of:

PDF Browser Plug-in 2.2.3 English, Deutsch

4.A Standard Download window will appear. Click on the OK button.

5.The plug-in will download to your desktop where you will see an icon named pdf-plugin-223.dmg .

6.Minimize your Browser window.

7.Click twice on the pdf-plugin-223.dmg icon to unpack the plug-in. You will see a new icon on your desktop for the PDF Browser Plugin 2.2.3 .

8.Open your main volume by clicking on it s icon on your desktop.

9.Open the Library folder by clicking on it.

10.Open the Internet Plug-ins Folder by clicking on it.

11.Single Click and hold the button down on the PDF Browser Plugin 2.2.3 icon and drag it into the Internet Plug-ins window.

12.Your plug-in is now installed correctly and you should be able to view PDF formatted eBooks.

If it is an INTEL based Mac see below: "Rosetta emulation" in Firefox

If it is an INTEL based Mac, you may have to enable something called "Rosetta emulation" in Firefox. To do this, perform the following steps (obtained from <http://kb.adobe.com/selfservice/viewContent.do?externalId=82216d24>):

Although the below instructions talk about Shockwave, this also applies to the Schubert It PDF plugin.

Launching a Browser in Rosetta Emulation Mode

Applications like both Safari and Firefox default to running in native mode on the new Intel-based Macs and therefore you must follow a few simple steps to instead have then run in Rosetta emulation mode:

Quit out of the browser.

Go to your Applications folder and control-click on the browser application bundle.

In the context menu that appears select Get Info.

Under the General heading of the Info dialog select "Open using Rosetta".

Close the Info dialog box.

After completing the above steps the browser will now run in Rosetta emulation mode.
