WHAT CAN THE TRANSFER COUNSELING CENTER DO FOR YOU?

The Transfer Counseling Center's programs and services are designed to assist transfer students from the moment they begin their academic endeavors at Butte College to the moment they are transfer-ready to the university of their choice.

WHAT SERVICES/PROGRAMS ARE PROVIDED BY THE TRANSFER COUNSELING CENTER?

- Exploration of major, university, and career options and opportunities
- Individualized Student Educational Plans (SEPs) specific to the four-year university of your choice
- On-The-Spot-Admission (OTSA) workshops with California State University (CSU) Chico, Humboldt State, and Sacramento State
- Transfer Admission Guarantees (TAGs) with many University of California (UC) campuses and some private universities. Ask our counselors what universities we collaborate with!
- CSU and UC Admission Application Workshops
- Intersegmental General Education Transfer Course (IGETC) Certification for UC or CSU admission
- Transfer Day (an average of 40 + colleges from across the United States participate each fall semester)
- On-campus university recruiter visits from across the country
- ASSIST Articulation with UC, CSUs, California Community Colleges, and some private universities
- Priority admission filing dates and information on what universities are still open after filing deadlines

INTRODUCING THE CROSS ENROLLMENT PROGRAM (XEN WITH CHICO STATE)

The Transfer Counseling Center is pleased to announce the start of an exciting new program that will benefit all students planning to attend CSU, Chico. The Cross Enrollment Program (XEN) allows students to enroll in one 3– unit class at Chico State AT NO CHARGE – WITH NO APPLICATION FEE OR UNIT FEE, and access to all services except Health Services. This is an invaluable program for students with majors where Butte College offers only a few lower division classes.

Once the participants complete 45 transferable units, they are then eligible to enroll in an upper division course. Students are then eligible to participate in the program for up to two years. XEN (Cross Enrollment) members will also have the opportunity to meet with an evaluator from Chico each semester. Each semester XEN applications are accepted for review.

Program Requirements:

This program is available to Butte College students who meet the following requirements:

- Completed English 2
- Completed a minimum of 30 transferable units
- Have demonstrated progress towards a transferrable math class
- Have 2.0 or greater G.P.A.

Enrollment closes FAST - so set an appointment today!

Transfer FAQs

Question: When should I use the Transfer Counseling Center?

Answer: **ASAP!** When you begin to think about transferring you should seek our help. We can definitely help you transfer more quickly and efficiently by helping you find out more about the school(s) you are interested in, and we can get you information about the GE (General Education) and lower division class requirements for your transfer major. Depending on your major, you might even get some GE's waived! Come on in and get the information you need!

Question: Do universities accept admission applications after the priority filing period is over?

Answer: Yes! Even after the priority filing period, some CSUs and UCs continue to accept admission applications. To see what universities are still open after the priority filing period is over, go to the Transfer Counseling Center website (see url top of page). Click on "Status Report" on our navigation bar, then select the type of university you want to check on (e.g. CSU or UC).

Question: What does upper-division transfer status mean?

Answer: To be upper-division (junior status) you must have completed 60 transferable units by the time you are transfer-ready. At least 30 of the 60 units must be general education courses. Courses **MUST** be completed with a letter grade of "C" or better posted to your transcript prior to transfer, including all of AREA A and B4 on the CSU G.E. sheet. Impacted and competitive majors may have additional requirements – check with one of our transfer counselors!
