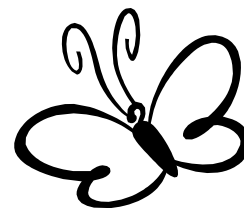

Learn how to advocate for your child and educate others about your child's needs while still being able to maintain your-and your child's privacy and dignity.
- Meeting your child's unmet emotional needs. The "How" in "How to parent the attachment challenged child."

- Videos from well-known attachment parents and therapists will be part of this class session
- Things that work well, things that work better...
- Trouble-Shooting issues that are specific to your youth/situation will be covered in today's class.
