For successful applicants for positions:

- A medical certificate is required showing that the applicant is free from any communicable disease, including, but not limited to, active tuberculosis, hepatitis, pertussis, Norovirus, COVID-19, head lice, unfitting the applicant to instruct or associate with students.
- The medical certificate shall be submitted by a physician as authorized by law.
- The medical examination is conducted not more than six months before the submission of the certificate and is at the expense of the applicant.
- A contract of employment may be offered to an applicant subject to the submission of the required medical certificate.
- The medical certificate becomes a part of the personnel record of the employee and is open to inspection by the employee or their designee.

If risk factors for Tuberculosis were present at the risk assessment, and an examination occurs, after the examination the employee shall provide the District with a certificate from the employee's examining physician showing that the employee was examined and found to be free from active tuberculosis.

All employees shall be required to undergo an examination within four years of employment and every four years thereafter, to determine if they are free from any communicable diseases including but not limited to Tuberculosis.
