1. Campus Strategic Documents Chart

College Council reviewed three draft charts for the Institutional Effectiveness Manual to illustrate the hierarchy of the strategic documents that guide the college's work. Council members discussed possible modifications to the charts to make the origin of each document clearer, as well as how to demonstrate the relationships between state- and system-wide documents and those created by Butte College. The chart also needs to demonstrate the college's three pillars of DEIA², Guided Pathways, and Sustainability. Vice President Shearer and IDEA Officer Robinson will continue to work on the chart, which will eventually go to Leadership for input.

2. Strategic Planning Retreat

President Guleff outlined the strategic planning process which will take place in the spring with the participation of campus community members from all constituent groups. Work groups of 15-20 people will be formed for each of the six strategic initiatives and generate work plans that outline how the college will address the initiatives. In addition to defining strategies and outcomes, the work plans will create a framework for accountability. The work plans will be refined over the course of the spring semester and then put together into a college strategic plan. College Council will receive updates on the strategic initiative work plans starting next year as part of the accountability component.

3. Discussion of Fall Welcome Week

IDEA Officer Robinson reported that there have been ongoing discussions about the experiences the college would like to provide for students when they come back in fall. Various departments and groups offer activities. He suggested forming a committee or taskforce to create a cohesive, campus-wide first week experience that culminates in a big experience at the end of the week. The idea is to be intentional about messaging to students, especially in terms of what it means to be a Butte student. The effort is also related to the portion of our mission statement about being "student ready." Council members discussed the concept and how to create events that will allow staff and faculty support and participation.
